



September 22, 2015 – Discovery Safety Meeting – Ozona, TX

- Rocker B Ranch Manager discussed areas of concern which he would like for all companies to follow:
  - Watch for fires
  - No Hunting of any sort while on the property
  - No removal of animal parts or horns if found in the area
  - Kill all Rattlesnakes, but leave other snakes alone
  - No removal of artifacts from the Rocker B Ranch
  - No pets allowed in the Rocker B Ranch
  - Employees only on ranch, NO FAMILY or FRIENDS ALLOWED!!!
  - Damage to property must be reported, it's recommended
  - More cattle has been added and ranch is fully stocked so more signs have been posted and speed limits have been lowered to avoid any accidents with animals being hit
- Discovery Natural Resources Safety Points:
  - Shooting for Zero Incidents, but need to report all first aid to manage to avoid reoccurrence
  - Provide feedback while out in the field regarding any safety, mechanical, environmental, or equipment needing attention
  - Stop Work Authority needs to be used in any situation that presents a hazard before or during a job task
- Guest speaker Brad Livingston:
  - 10 yrs on pipeline before his big accident that changed his life and ended his friends
  - Explosion caused by not gauging tanks which was a 5-10 minute task and 100% preventable
  - Received 3<sup>rd</sup> degree burns to 63% of his body, loss muscle in both legs, loss partial use of hands and strength, and has affected his family by the "RIPPLE EFFECT"

September 30, 2015 – Enervest Safety Meeting - Sonora, TX

- Oil & Gas Industry that from 2003-2014, 1300 workers were killed annually and 43% are because of vehicle accidents
- In 2014 there were 1400 Non-Fatal Injuries nationwide
- Enervest Contractor Program will have a letter sent out along with a form to fill with info on company doing work with company and will allow them to know about our Safety Plan which will require a follow up or face-to-face meeting to cover Safety Plan in order to help out
- They also want to know our PPE Program
- They want to be careful with employees using electric impacts while working at battery stations or wells
- JSAs are required before the start of each job and is recommended that all employees take turns filling it out instead of just the Pusher or Leadman
- Always utilize pre-job planning before each job task to determine what equipment is needed and what PPE will be used in order to help employees while working
- Report all incidents no matter how small so we can work with Enervest on finding root cause and finding a better solution
- All Near Misses need to be reported immediately to determine the issue before a reoccurrence
- FA/CPR are required being that employees are away 10 minutes from nearest Hospital or ER
- Enervest wants to work with all Contractors to help out with any safety issues that might need attention in order to find the right solution

October 1, 2015 – Discovery Natural Resources – Barnhart, TX

- One Call Meeting with Melissa Brannan with TEXAS811
- Incidents that occurred were due to 29% Not Calling before Digging and 16% because Facility was not located or marked correctly or someone didn't come out to mark area
- New smartphone app for Fast Customer response
- Employees can also text TEXAS811 to 936-225-5757 and they'll receive a call in order as it is received
- TEXAS811 Portal – [txgc.texas811.org](http://txgc.texas811.org)
- TEXAS811 app will give GPS locate and be able to submit a ticket, but you will still need driving locations
- Must call 2 working days before, but not more than 14 days before starting to dig
- In an emergency, you can start digging, but you are still responsible for any incidents
- You have 14 days per ticket to complete job or you would need to call and update the ticket by requesting it on or before the 12<sup>th</sup> day to continue without interruption



- Must wait 48 hrs before digging and must always have ticket on hand at working site
- Must call to report hitting a line within 2 hrs and you have 10 days to submit a TDRF to RRC
- You hit a pipeline, you leave equipment as is and get as far as possible, upwind/uphill. Don't jump in a car and drive off because you're trying to avoid an ignition source to avoid possible fire or explosion
- Damage Prevention Councils of TX meet every other month

- No piggy backing on same ticket by two different contractors. Must call and as to duplicate ticket for each contractor on site
- POST HOLE DIGGING requires One Call as well....

#### October 1, 2015 – Apache Safety Meeting – SAU

- Xavier Martinez introduced Area Safety Director, Steve Slezinski
- New Safety Code – Aim For Zero
  - Believe we can do it
  - Know we can do it
  - Account for all measures of job to complete safely
  - STOP work when unsafe
- Call your Apache Supervisor or Asst. Foreman once JSA is completed or call Xavier if no one answers to allow continuation of job. JSA is a TEAM JOB!
- Report all visual defects to prevent any incidents
- Hold Safety Meetings in afternoons so no one rushes in the morning
- Rotate on JSA so everyone can learn to fill one out either English or Spanish or both
- Work at a SAFE pace, but slow enough to complete job safely
